2006 CLINIC FEATURED SPEAKERS



JOHN BEILEIN - WEST VIRGINIA UNIVERSITY

Coach Beilein became the Head Coach of the Mountaineers in 2002. Success has followed Beilein at nearly every coaching stop. He has compiled 24 winning seasons as well as putting together twelve 20 win seasons. Currently Coach Beilein is the only person in Collegiate Coaching -----ranks to record a 20 win season at four different ---- levels, Junior College, NAIA, NCAA Division II and Division I.

Last season Coach Beilein led the Mountaineers to wins over a school record eight ranked teams. The Mountaineers earned a number seven seed in the NCAA tournament and advanced to the Elite 8 for the first time since 1958. Coach Beilein has also led Richmond and Canisius to NCAA Division I tournament appearances.

His teams have an outstanding graduation rate. Coach Beilein has 502 career wins and ranks 22nd in victories among active Division I head coaches.



ROB JETER - UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN - MILWAUKEE

This has been coach Rob Jeter's first season as head coach at the University of Wisconsin Milwaukee. He served the past four seasons as Bo Ryan's number one assistant at the University of Wisconsin. During this time the University of Wisconsin made four NCAA Tournament appearances, reached the Sweet 16 in 2003 and the Elite 8 in 2005. The Badgers also won two Big Ten regular season titles and one league tournament title.

Coach Jeter played his college ball at the University of Wisconsin at Platteville for Coach Ryan. In 1991 he captained the Pioneers to the 1991 Division III title and was named to the All-Final Four team. Jeter then played professionally in Portugal, leading the Portuguese national league in scoring.

Coach Jeter has a Bachelor's Degree in business administration and received a Master's Degree in adult education in 2001.



MUFFET MCGRAW - UNIVERSITY OF NOTRE DAME

Muffet McGraw recently completed her 18th season as the head women's basketball coach at Notre Dame with a combined record of 411-155 (73%). She is the most successful basketball coach (men's or women's) in Notre Dame history and is poised to become the 27th coach in NCAA Division I history to record 500 career victories. Her over all career record in 23 years as a head coach is 499-196 (72%).

McGraw's resume with the Irish has been outstanding. Going into this past season, she has led Notre Dame to 12 NCAA Tournament appearances (including a current streak of 10 in a row) and has amassed sixteen 20-win seasons in her 18-year run (including an active streak of 12 in a row). She also has piloted the Irish to six NCAA Sweet 16 berths, as well as two trips to the Final Four and the 2001 national championship.

Her biggest success has come since Notre Dame joined the Big East Conference a decade ago. In that time, McGraw has guided the Irish to a 252-75 (77%) record and nine top-three finishes in her team's 10 seasons in the league. Furthermore, she has coached eight All-Americans and has had 12 of her players go on to play in the WNBA.



TUBBY SMITH - UNIVERSITY OF KENTUCKY

Since arriving at the University of Kentucky eight seasons ago, Coach Smith has led the Wildcats to one National Championship, five SEC Crowns, five SEC Tournament titles, and six Sweet 16 finishes. In the previous three seasons no Division I school has won as consistently as Kentucky. Coach Smith's Wildcats are 51-6 in SEC Competitions and 87-15 overall. This represents the best winning percentage in the nation (85%) with the fewest losses.

Coach Smith's teams have always been known for their solid defense and rebounding. In 2003 he was recognized for his coaching excellence by receiving all seven of the National Coach of the Year honors recognized by the NCAA – AP, USBWA, NAISMITH, BASKETBALL TIMES, THE SPORTING NEWS, NABC and CBS/CHEVROLET. He became the first coach to sweep the list since Indiana's Bob Knight in 1975.

Over his 14 seasons as a head coach, the 54 year old has had 12 consecutive 20-win seasons. In 2005 he joined Roy Williams (388) and Jim Boeheim (343) as the third coach to win 340 games in 14 seasons or less. Going into the 2005-2006 season Coach Smith's career record is 343-120, and his 74% winning percentage is seventh among active coaches.



ROY GARDNER AWARD: KEN GORRELL

Ken is a graduate of Southwestern High School and Ball State University. While attending Ball State, Ken began his officiating career doing intramural games. After graduation he began his teaching career at Franklin Community School Corporation where he has been for the past 39 years.

During his officiating career, Ken has worked his way up the ranks of IHSAA tournaments. He has worked 13 Sectionals, 11 Regionals, eight Semi-States and three State Finals. He also has officiated Division I, II, and III men's basketball. In 1995 and 1996, he worked the Division II National Championships. Ken's wife Janet, along with his three children, Lisa, Chad, and Austin, have contributed to his successful officiating career with their support, sacrifices and understanding.



MILDRED BALL AWARD: Patty Broderick

Patty is a graduate of Indiana University –Purdue University at Indianapolis. She began her officiating career in 1972, while coaching grade school basketball. She has extensive high school, college, international and WNBA professional basketball officiating experience. Patty officiated the Indiana High School basketball State Finals in 1982 and 1983. She also worked four NCAA Women's Final Fours from 1986-1992.

Patty became the first woman to officiate women's basketball at the Pan Am Games in 1987 and was one of only two American officials who worked at the Seoul Olympics in 1988. In 1988, Patty was the Inaugural Winner of the Naismith Female Basketball Official of the Year Award.

Patty has served as the Big Ten's Coordinator of women's basketball officials since 1987. She resides in Indianapolis. Her daughter Jamie, graduated from

VIRGIL SWEET DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD RECIPIENTS

Each year the IBCA Board of Directors selects individuals from each of the three IBCA Districts to receive the Virgil Sweet Distinguished Service Award. The award, named in honor of the longtime Executive Director of the IBCA, are given to individuals who have provided meritorious service promoting basketball in the state of Indiana.

The six recipients featured below will receive their awards during the IBCA clinic Friday, April 28, 2006.

DISTRICT I - HOMER DREW

Homer Drew is currently in his 17th season as the Head Basketball Coach at Valparaiso University. He has also coached college basketball in Indiana at Indiana University of South Bend and Bethel College. Coach Drew, with the help of his staff, has built Valparaiso University basketball into one of the finest midmajor Division I programs in the nation. Drew ranks 12th among active Division I coaches with 538 victories during his 27 seasons as a head coach.



In 1998, Coach Drew led the Crusaders to a first ever NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 appearance. A dramatic win over Ole Miss in the opening round will always be remembered for "the shot" when son Bryce's buzzer beating three pointer became a focal point of the highlights of all major networks and news shows across the nation.

Coach Drew is one of only seven Division I coaches to have six consecutive 20 win seasons. The Crusaders have won six Mid-Continent Conference Championships in the past seven years and Coach Drew three times has been named Mid-Continent Conference Coach of the Year.

Coach Drew has toured, coached, and conducted clinics in Europe during his career. He has produced instructional video tapes and is a co-author of a book [Find A Way...A Sweet Season](#).

Coach Drew, the IBCA thanks you for the positive impact you have had on Indiana High School Basketball.

DISTRICT I - MIKE HEY

In 2005, after 38 years, Coach Hey retired from teaching and coaching. He began his teaching and coaching career in the Fort Wayne school system before moving to Leo. At Leo he coached basketball at various levels before leading the Leo girls' basketball program for 26 years. During his career, he coached Leo in the Hall of Fame tournament, served as an Indiana All Star Coach, coached the Reebok Indiana North Junior All Stars and has received numerous Coach of the Year awards. Coach Hey's teams were known for their outstanding defense, holding teams to less than 47 points per game. His teams won 15 conference championships, 11 county tournaments, five sectional championships and one regional championship. Coach Hey is the 12th winningest coach in Indiana girl's basketball history with 360 victories. Coach Hey and his wife Judy, a math teacher at Leo, have five children and five grandchildren. Coach, congratulations on an outstanding career. The IBCA salutes you for your contributions to Indiana High School Basketball.



DISTRICT II - GENE MILNER

Gene is a 1963 graduate of Rossville High School where he was a four year letterman for Hall of Fame coach Phil Buck. As a senior he averaged over 30+ points per game and was the leading scorer in the state. Gene played his college ball at Butler and was a starter for another Hall of Fame coach and legend Tony Hinkle. In 1967 Gene was chosen to play in the Indiana vs. Kentucky College All-Star game.



Gene coached high school basketball from 1968 to 1976. During the 1975-76 season, he was involved in a severe automobile accident and after several surgeries spent his last year coaching in a full body cast. The Hall of Fame selected Gene to the 1988 Silver Anniversary Team.

Since 1983 Gene has published the Indiana High School Basketball Record Book and has served as the IBCA Job Placement Director. In 2003, Gene assumed the newly created IBCA website coordinator position.

Gene, thanks for all you have done and continue to do for high school basketball in Indiana.

DISTRICT II - HERB SCHWOMEYER

Herb is a graduate of Indianapolis Manual High School. He earned both his Bachelor and Masters Degrees at Butler University. His Doctorate was earned at Indiana University. After teaching and coaching at the high school level, Herb served Butler University in various positions from 1945 to 1983. He was an assistant to Paul D. "Tony" Hinkle for six years in football, basketball and baseball as well as serving as the assistant athletic director. He also acted as an admission counselor and Butler University Dean of Men during his 38 year career.



Herb was a licensed IHSAA football and basketball official for 12 years. He officiated the 1955 and 1956 IHSAA Basketball Tournament State Finals. For 21 years he assisted with IHSAA State Basketball tournament telecast for station WRTV Channel 6.

Herb has received just about every major award Butler University has to offer. He has been a member of the Indiana Basketball Hall of Fame Board of Directors since 1965. In 1974 Herb was honored with the coveted Silver Medal and was elected to the Indiana Basketball Hall of Fame. He has received many awards from the state of Indiana including the "Sagamore of the Wabash" from Governor Robert Orr in 1983.

During his illustrious career, Herb also found time to be an author. He wrote Hoosier Hysteria (A History of Indiana High School Boys Single Class Basketball). Herb, thanks for all you have done for high school basketball in the state of Indiana.

DISTRICT III - DAN EGIERSKI

Dan is a native of South Bend where he played high school football and baseball at La Salle High School. He graduated with a degree in Interpersonal Communications from the University of Evansville in 1978. Dan began his broadcasting career at Tell City in 1979. In 1986 he moved to Evansville and became the sports director at WGBF radio. During his 20 year career in Evansville, Dan has been the play by play voice for the local high school football and basketball teams. He also has had the opportunity to provide play by play for numerous high school championship games involving Evansville schools. In 1989 Dan became the voice of the University of Southern Indiana Men's Basketball team and called their three Division II Basketball National Championship games in 1994, 1995, and 2004.



Dan has received numerous state wide awards for broadcasting from both Network Indiana and the Associated Press. In 2001 he received the Distinguished Media Award in District 3 from the Indiana High School Athlete Association. He and his wife are the proud parents of a son Ryan and a daughter Lauren. DISTRICT III - ORLANDO "GUNNER" WYMAN

Orlando "Gunner" Wyman is a native of Mayfield, Kentucky. After serving in the Marine Corps in World War II he graduated from Florida State University where he was a three year letterman in basketball. He earned his Masters Degree from Western Kentucky University.



He coached varsity basketball for 29 years. The first six years were in Kentucky with the last 23 in Indiana. Tell City was his first job in Indiana. In four years there, the Marksmen won three sectionals, three regionals, and the 1961 semi-state. From there he moved on to Hammond High School where he coached two sectional championship teams.

After five years in Hammond he moved to Vincennes Lincoln where he led the Alices to 11 sectionals, four regionals, one semi-state, and the state championship in 1981.

INDIANA VS. KENTUCKY ALL-STARS GAMES JUNE 17 & 24; FORMER ALL-STARS IN THE YEARS ENDING IN '6' TO BE HONORED

With the 50th and 30th anniversaries of two Indiana basketball icons Mr. Basketball Oscar Robertson and Miss Basketball Judi Warren, respectively, the 2006 Indiana-Kentucky All-Star series offers a tasty mix of nostalgia and extreme anticipation.

Obviously a very, very strong candidate for this year's Mr. Basketball (the team won't be announced until April 26), Lawrence North's Greg Oden would bring with him designation as the nation's top senior player and winner already of numerous accolades and national TV exposure.

Indiana's boys and girls will meet their Kentucky counterparts at Western Kentucky University's homecourt in Bowling Green on June 17. The action will return to Consecro Fieldhouse Saturday, June 24.

Because of the likelihood of Oden and what critics say will be among the best of Indiana's boys and girls squads this year, officials at The Indianapolis Star---game sponsors since 1939---anticipate one of the largest crowds at Consecro Fieldhouse in the past 10 years.

Leading to the expectation that 2006 will also be a very good year for charities that benefit from the Star's All-Star sponsorship is the fact that again this year the two Indiana All-Star teams will play three exhibition games at three different sites against what's expected to be exceptional Indiana Junior All-Star teams.

Sites for the exhibition games have not yet been determined, according to Indiana Game Director Patrick Aikman. If the past provides a clue, however, they will be played in communities that produce senior or junior All-Stars. Usually, according to Aikman, communities and schools that want to host the exhibitions contact him to express their interest.

There definitely will be 24 junior girls and 24 junior boys selected for these events by their respective coaching committees. Six "core" players will be selected for the boys' team and six for the girls' team. These players will appear in all three exhibition matchups. Furthermore, there'll be six boys and six girls selected from generally the north, central and south parts of the state to join the core groups. "Our object will be to select the best 48 juniors in the state as the top priority, with their geographic origin a secondary consideration," Aikman pointed out. "We don't want to put geography considerations ahead of selecting the best players in the state, but we will look at where players come from, but it just won't be the paramount deciding factor."



The exhibition games, wherever they are played, will probably be scheduled on June 14, June 20 and June 22.

"Alumni" All-Stars from the years 1946, 1956, 1966, 1976, 1986 and 1996 will be honored at a reception at Consecro Fieldhouse June 24 and will be introduced during the Indiana-Kentucky games. The Star is already seeking information on addresses for those former All-Stars it expects to honor this summer.

Splitting the series last year with Kentucky, Indiana leads the girls series, 32-28, after winning 21 of the last 28 games with the Bluegrass girls. The Indiana boys hold a commanding 75-41 edge in the series. The Indiana boys swept last year's games, winning by double digits in both states.

The Indiana girls' coaches will be announced March 5 followed by an announcement of the boys' coaches a week later. Miss Basketball and Mr. Basketball will be announced on March 19 and April 9, respectively. The girls' team will be announced March 26 and the boys' team on April 26. Ballots for the girls' All-Star team went out Feb. 21. Ballots for the boys' team were scheduled to go out March 13. If you are an eligible voter (boys' or girls' head coach or a member of the media) you may request a ballot if you did not receive one via e-mail. Call 317-444-7322.
