Sean Miller

Head Coach, Xavier University

Sean probably has more job security than anyone present, recently signing a contract that runs through 2016. And why not! He's been head coach, associate or assistant for 12 teams that have advanced to post season play in his first 15 years! He came to Xavier after coaching stops at North Carolina State, his alma mater Pittsburgh '92, Miami (OH), and Wisconsin. In his first three years as Xavier's head man, he's averaged 21 wins per season. He was Thad Matt's right hand man for three years with the Musketeers and had three consecutive 26 win seasons. His 2007 team finished 25-9 and won the Atlantic 10 championship and earned Xavier's second straight NCAA bid. As of late February, Miller's 2007-08 team was rated 10th in the nation with a 24-4 record. The team already has assured itself of an Atlantic 10 championship.



Greg Tonagel

Head Coach, Indiana Wesleyan University

In two short years, former LaPorte H.S. and Valparaiso University star Greg Tonagel has led Wesleyan's Wildcats to a conference runner-up spot in his first season and an "Elite 8" finish in last year's NAIA national tournament with a 30-5 record. As one of the nation's youngest head coaches, he has a 47-19 record. Prior to his current position, Tonagel served as the director of basketball operations at Valparaiso University. In high school he let LaPorte to the last single class state finals in 1997 and was an Indiana All-Star.

Head Coach, St. Louis University

After coaching stints with Marquette, the NBA Milwaukee Bucks, Ball State, Utah and now St. Louis University, Rick has also served as an ESPN and CBS basketball analyst. In 32 years on the bench as a head coach or assistant coach, he's been part of 734 wins, 27 post season appearances, three NCAA Final Four slots, a NIT semi-finalist, and one national championship. He joined St. Louis University staff this year as head coach to rejuvenate the program.



Brad Stevens

Head Coach, Butler University

Brad is a Zionsville High School graduate and has a B.A. degree in Economics from DePauw University where he was a four year member and team captain of the Basketball team.

He left a position as a marketing associate at Eli Lilly to pursue a career in basketball coaching. He served as a volunteer at the Carmel High School before becoming a volunteer on Thad Matta's staff at Butler University in the fall of 2000. He also served as Coordinator of Basketball Operations and for six seasons was an Assistant on Todd Lickliter's staff. Three days after Lickliter was named head coach at the University of Iowa, Coach Stevens became the third consecutive former Butler Assistant to be named Head Coach.

In his first season as Headman, Coach Stevens led the Bulldogs to a 29-3 regular season record, a #12 National Ranking and a regular season and tournament Horizon League Championship. Coach Steven will speak about "How to utilize the undersized player".

Jason Groves

District 1 - Triton High School

A graduate of John Glenn High School, Jason went on to play for Mike Lightfoot at Bethel College which won a national championship. He later taught at West Central High School for two years and then became junior varsity coach at Triton from 2000-2005. His squads have done progressively better each year, starting at 4-17 in 2004-05. Presently (the end of

February) the Trojans are 16-1, heading with optimism into the first round of sectional play.



Tom Peller

District 1 - Chesterton

Tom is a 1983 graduate of the University of Indianapolis. He was an assistant at Merrillville and Chesterton before assuming the Trojans head coach position in 2003. This past season Coach Peller led Chesterton to a 19-3 record and were ranked in the IBCA Coaches Poll Top 10 most of the season. His six year overall coaching

record is 83-45



Travis Daugherty

District 2 - Tipton High School

Travis Daugherty graduated from Alexandria High School and Anderson University and launched his career under the mentorship of coaching legend Garth Cone. After two years as an assistant under Cone, Travis took over the direction of the Tipton Blue Devils in 2004-05. He's enhanced the win column each year. He led this

year's team to its first ever Hoosier Conference title with an undefeated 6-0 season. In fact, his squad spent much of the current season as the Associated Press' No. 1 team in Class 2A and reached as high as No. 9 in the IBCA coaches poll.



Mark Galloway

District 2 - Carmel High School

Coach Galloway is a graduate of Plainfield High School and Bethel College. He is 102-36 in 6 years at Carmel. This past season the Greyhounds were 18-2 and Co-MIC Conference Champs for the 1st time in school history. In 2006, Mark led the Grayhounds to a Hamilton County Championship and sectional championships in 2006 and 2008.



J.R. Holmes

District # - Bloomington South High School

Coach J.R. Holmes is wrapping up his 38th year in coaching with a record of 580 wins---almost 15 victories every season! He's coached at Tunnelton, Mitchell and at Bloomington South high schools. His teams have won eleven sectionals and six regionals. J.R. has led his teams to 10 conference titles and he's had three different teams in the IHSAA's Final Four. This year he is working on Bloomington South's fourth consecutive twenty plus

win season.

John Lewellen

District 2 - Cambridge City Lincoln High School

Cambridge City Lincoln High School's John Lewellen has been in the coaching game for 21 successful years. His teams have compiled a career record for him of 267-171 and a record of 106-41 in the Tri Eastern Conference. Since 1994-95 his CCLHS teams have claimed a conference title about every other year, claiming crowns in 1995, 99, 03, 05, 07 and this year when his squad finished with a 7-0 conference mark and a season record of 17-4. Lincoln has also won sectional titles in the past four years and was regional runner-up in 2005 under Coach Lewellen's leadership.



Brad Bowsman

District 2 - Twin Lakes High School

A pre-algebra teacher at Twin Lakes for eight years, Brad has the X factor well defined when it comes to coaching the Indians' girls team the past five seasons. He's led the Lady Indians to an 87-30 record, two Hoosier Conference crowns and one sectional title. Completing the trifecta this season, his teams won the Journal & Courier Hoops Classic, the Indians' own holiday tourney, and the conference crown. With a 22-2 record, this year's squad was rated No. 1 in 3A for the first time in school history and finished the campaign ranked No. 2.

Kem Zolman

District 1 - Wawasee High School

After five years as boys Junior High coach at his alma mater, Churubusco, Kem added two more years' seasoning at Bloomington South then joined the Wawasee boys team as JV and varsity assistant for 10 years. For the past decade he's guided the Wawasee girls team, including his Miss Basketball daughter, to a combined 163-68 record and a 2008 semi-state showdown. He's tutored four sectional championship teams, two regional champs and was state runners-up last year. The Lady Warriors have had three perfect conference seasons and were Hall of Fame Classic runners-up in 2002. Kem has been conference coach of the year three times and the ICGSA's District COTY in 2001. He has degrees from IU.



Scott Smith

District 3 - Jac-Cen-Del

Coach Smith is a 1983 graduate of Jac-Cen-Del. He has coached at Jac-Cen-Del for 12 years, including 7 as girl's Varsity coach. His teams have won 4 Sectionals, 2 Ohio River Valley Conference titles, and 2 Ripley County Championships. His varsity record at JCD is 105-56 (.652). The Lady Eagles finished this season 20-3 and spent much of the year ranked #2 in Class 1A, despite losing 4 starters from last season's 18-5 squad. He has coached 8th grade boy's basketball, girl's JV basketball, as well as serving as boy's Varsity golf coach. He and his wife, Vickie, have two children. Heather (Huff), a former player and Trent, a 7th grader at JCD.



Dori Downing

District 1 - Calumet

A native of Northwest Indiana, Dori graduated from Munster High School, where she participated in basketball and track. She play college basketball at Purdue's Calumet campus from 1983-87 and won the school's Chancellor's Academic Award twice. Her coaching career began with the East Chicgo Cental JUnion Varsity from 1990-1996, working under JV coach Joe Huppenthal. At Calumet the past 12 seasons, her team have compiled a 109-157 record, playing in the Greater South Shore Conference. Her team won divisional championships in 2002 and 03 and they captured sectional titles on four occasions, earning her commendations and

VIRGIL SWEET DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD RECIPIENTS



The award, named in honor of longtime Executive Director of the IBCA, are given to individuals who have provided meritorious service in the promotion of basketball in the state of Indiana.



Fred Mitchell

District I

Fred Mitchell has had his hand and heart in high school sports and administration for 46 years, working first in Blytheville, AR and then moving back to the Valparaiso-Chesterton area. He was Chesterton's head boys' basketball coach, starting in 1977, and was coach of the year in 1983 in District I. In 1989, he became assistant athletic director at Chesterton and three years later became varsity assistant for the girls basketball team. He retired from teaching in 1998 but remains as assistant athletic director and girls basketball assistant at Chesterton. Fred, thanks for your contributions.



Roger Dickinson

District II - Executive Director of the Indiana Basketball Hall of Fame

Roger was a multi-sport athlete at Frankton High School then earned B.S. and M.A. degrees at Ball State, where he also received his administrative credentials. He coached basketball and baseball at Albany High School for four years and also served as guidance counselor, athletic director and eventually as principal. He was superintendent of the West Central School Corporation in Francesville for 21 years before assuming his current post at the Hall of Fame in 1999. Several honors have come his way in a lifetime of service: the St. Vincent Silver Medal from the Hall of Fame board, induction into the Hall of Fame, the presidency of the Indiana Association of Public School Superintendents, recognition by the Indiana House of Representatives, District 1 Superintendent of the Year, and the Bell Ringers Award from the State Superintendent of Public Instruction. Roger, thanks for all you do for high school basketball.

Chris James

District III - WQKZ and WITZ Sports Announcer

Vincennes University's school of broadcasting prepared the 1989 Perry Central graduate for a career that brought high school football and basketball coverage to unserved and under served southern Indiana communities. He started at WTCJ in Tell City as a VU student then transitioned to sports broadcasting in Huntingburg and Santa Claus. He joined WQKZ and WITZ in 1997, serving as lead sports announcer that led to state championship coverage of the Forest Park Rangers' boys and girls teams as well as tournament coverage of the Jasper Wildcats and Perry Central Commodores. Already he has twice been named winner of the Indiana Baseball Coaches District O announcer-of-the-year award.

District I - WEFM, Michigan City

Broadcaster Chris Jones remembers the recent past--in the early 1980s--when Dan Palambizio and Delay Brooks were throwing them in regularly for Michigan City Rogers. Friend Tom Wells recalls that Chris 'did an excellent job.' "And still does!" "With a great radio voice and true knowledge and insight into the sport he loves and covers." Chris has done play by play for WCOE (The Eagle) for three different sports--football, basketball and baseball since 1997-98. He also inspired and owned the LaPorte newspaper "Town Crier" for ten years and was responsible for the sports section including LaPorte County sports updates and a Coaches' Roundtable conversation that was highly popular. He has also broadcast with many other colorful color commentators including current radio personality Mike Ferrin.

Bob Kirkoff

District II



Bob is a graduate of Cathedral High School, St. Edwards University, Austin Texas and a U. S. Army Veteran. For 46 years his devotion to teaching young athletes combined with his enthusiasm and knowledge of the game of basketball has enabled him to continue to be an effective coach.

During his 19 years as Varsity Basketball Coach at Roncalli, he led the Rebels to nine City Championships, eight Sectional, four Regional Championships and a State Runner-up. Bob was Marion county Coach of the year three times and was an Indiana All Star Coach in 1993. His overall record was 324 wins-112 losses (74%).

He retired from Roncalli in 2002. In 2005 he came out of retirement and served as an assistant at Franklin Central and helped lead the Flashes to two Sectional Championships. This past season he was an Assistant at Chatard High School and helped lead the Trojans to a 3A State runner-Up.

Hello everyone. I am writing my article after watching some exciting games in the Girls State Championships. My congratulations go out to all eight teams who reached Conseco. I want to give a special shout out to Plymouth coach Dave Cox, whose team won a thrilling one-point game in the 3A contest. Dave and I are Rochester High School grads. He becomes the second Zebra grad to coach a state championship team. Jerry Oliver coached Indianapolis Washington to the Boys State Title in 1965.

In September I was approached by The Indianapolis Star Marketing Department to speak with them about becoming the Director of the Indiana All-Stars in our long-standing series against Kentucky. I agreed to accept the position if they would allow me to coach this season and then I would resign from coaching at the conclusion of the season.

But after learning quickly what all Pat Aikman actually had to deal with and do, and learning I am not ready to end my career in education and as a coach, I have decided I will not stay in the director's position after June. Announcing this now should allow The Star ample time to consider who the new director will be.

However, this year I'm a part of a major change in the Indiana-Kentucky All-Star Series. The Indiana Girls and Boys All-Stars will play our Kentucky counterparts on June 13th and June 15th. Yes, it is a one-weekend series this season. Much discussion went in to the decision, and with All-Stars asked to start their college obligations earlier and earlier each year by their coaches and schools, the one-week format will be used beginning this year. We will play Kentucky at Conseco Fieldhouse Friday evening, June 13, and play the traditional rematch with Kentucky on Sunday, June 15. That game will be at Louisville Gardens.

Two exhibition games against junior all-stars selected by the Indiana Basketball Coaches Association will be played, similar as the past. Sites of the games are still being discussed. Those games are tentatively scheduled for Monday June 9th and Wednesday June 11th.

Finally, I would like to take this opportunity to let the IBCA coaches know the dates for Indianapolis Star Indiana All-Star announcements. The Indianapolis Star announced the day of the girls state finals the Girls All-Star coaches. On March 20th the newspaper will announce Miss Basketball. Then on March 22nd the Boys All-Star coaches will be announced. On the next day, March 23rd, the Girls All-Star Team will be released by The Star. Finally in April Mr. Basketball will be announced on the 10th, with the Boys All-Star Team announced on April 20th.

Step 3 includes Aikman screening and editing (if needed) the information and forwarding it to our webmaster for inclusion as soon as possible for Best in Indiana on www.ibcacoaches.com.

What you have just read (the 75-word summary) is called Plan A. And it's a free service. There's a Plan B too...with a fee.

Under Plan B, you may expand the summary about your player to 150 words and add a photograph of your player. This option will cost \$75. Revenue from Plan B will help underwrite IBCA expenses. If you select Plan B, make your check payable to: IBCA Best in Indiana. Send it under separate cover to Aikman. Those who select Plan B will have their summaries posted when payment is received. 

Hoosier Hysteria and March Madness are Synonymous

School administrator, coach, referee, historian, author and hall of framer Herb Schwomeyer coined the phrase Hoosier Hysteria in 1970. Schwomeyer is the famed author that published nine editions of the book, Hoosier Hysteria.

Going back in time, high school basketball caught on in Indiana like no place in the world. The close proximity of the numerous schools throughout the state made the sport that much more competitive, as each school wanted bragging rights over their neighbor by defeating them in this famed game

called basketball.

Interest in basketball was high and since folks did not travel too far from home in the early years of the sport communities kept building bigger and bigger gymnasiums. The gymnasium that Coach John Wooden played in at Martinsville would seat over 5,000 fans even though the town's population was 4,800. Amazingly the gym had 16 locker rooms, as the community was in hopes of the state basketball championship games being held in the town of the artesian springs.

In 1928, Butler University opened the famed Butler Fieldhouse, later to be named Hinkle Fieldhouse, which was the largest gymnasium in the world. The same year Muncie opened the Muncie Fieldhouse, which was the largest high school gymnasium for nearly 30 years. Both facilities are still in use today and in remarkable condition.

Coach Wooden shared that approximately half of his games, while playing for Purdue University, were played at Lafayettee Jeff High School, as the school had a larger gym than existed on the West Lafayette campus. High school basketball continued to be the most popular game of the day and the transportation limitations kept people relatively close to home.

As the means of transportation continued to improve an increased interest in the collegiate game began to emerge. The pattern had already been established by Hoosier high schools, as the universities began to build bigger and bigger gymnasiums. Hall of Famer Everett Case left his Indiana roots and migrated to the State of North Carolina. With his encouragement the University of North Carolina State University opened the famed Reynolds Coliseum, which would seat 12,400 fans. This was the largest gymnasium throughout the entire "South" for a number of years.

In the mid to late 1940's the NIT, National Invitational Tournament, was the major tournament for colleges. Eventually the NCAA, National Collegiate Athletic Association, began to emerge as the premier collegiate tournament in the country. The format of play in determining a national champion masked that of the IHSAA, Indiana High School Athletic Association, state championship tournament.

High school basketball in Indiana was and is important to the culture and fiber of the local community. During the 2007-2008 season, it has been reported that a few schools have sold out the gymnasium by half time of the junior varsity game. Although this used to be a common occurrence it is refreshing to witness it happening once again.

The NCAA basketball tournament has continued to increase in popularity. With the exposure of basketball games on television every night of the week and the hype that is provided by newspapers, magazines and radio the collegiate game is BIG. Since the tournament trail occurs in March the slogan "March Madness" was adopted for the college tournament a few years ago.

Little did the early organizers of the Indiana high school state basketball tournament know that it would serve as a model for the collegiate game of today.
